
- "And once you live a good story, you get a taste for a kind of meaning in life, and you can't go back to being normal; you can't go back to meaningless scenes stitched together by the forgettable thread of wasted time."
- "If the point of life is the same as the point of a story, the point of life is character transformation. ... If the character doesn't change, the story hasn't happened yet. And if story is derived from real life, if story is just condensed version of life then life itself may be designed to change us so that we evolve from one kind of person to another. ... we were designed to live through something rather than to attain something, and the thing we were meant to live through was designed to change us. The point of a story is the character arc, the change." "
- "Fear isn't only a guide to keep us safe; it's also a manipulative emotion that can trick us into living a boring life ... the great stories go to those who don't give in to fear."
- "We live in a world where bad stories are told, stories that teach us life doesn't mean anything and that humanity has no great purpose. It's a good calling, then, to speak a better story. 





SIMON SINEK: START WITH WHY

- Very few people or companies can clearly articulate WHY they do WHAT they do.
 By WHY I mean your purpose, cause or belief WHY does your company exist?
 WHY do you get out of bed every morning? And WHY should anyone care?
- · People don't buy WHAT you do, they buy WHY you do it.
- · "As the Zen Buddhist saying goes, HOW you do anything is how you do everything."
- "The role of a leader is not to come up with all the great ideas. The role of a leader is to create an environment in which great ideas can happen."
- "Henry Ford summed it up best. "If I had asked people what they wanted," he said, "they would have said a faster horse."
- The Golden Circle is in balance. They are in pursuit of WHY, they hold themselves accountable to HOW they do it and WHAT they do serves as the tangible proof of what they believe."

- The only way people will know what you believe is by the things you say and do, and if you're not consistent in the things you say and do, no one will know what you believe.
- When you start with WHY, those who believe what you believe are drawn to you
 for very personal reasons. It is those who share your values and beliefs, not the
 quality of your products, that will cause the system to tip.
- Greatness is not born from one success. Greatness is born from persevering through the countless failed attempts that preceded.
- When we tell people to do their jobs, we get workers. When we trust people to get the job done, we get leaders.
- · When you are unclear about your WHY, WHAT you do has no context.


INTENTION

Objective is what the character wants, or what the character's goal is.

Intention, perhaps the most important job an actor has,

is the meaning of the line or what's going on in the actor's mind—the subtext.

INTENTION

an aim or plan.

from Latin intentio(n-) 'stretching, purpose,'

MY INTENTIONAL THOUGHTS...

- INTENTION MEANS stretching: stretching hurts, strains, is uncomfortable, & not easy.
- INTENTIONAL is purposeful, planned, designed.
- INTENTIONAL is extended toward something outside of itself, aimed.
- the purpose is outside of yourself.
- there is always a target.
- & something to send to the target
- & YOU are the person who works to send that something (a performance, an event, a play, etc...) towards our target...








- we will do what we can do EXCELLENTLY. not what we can phone in. not what

Narrate or relate (a tale or story).

A tell in poker is a change in a player's behavior or demeanor that is claimed by some to give clues to that player's assessment of their hand. A player gains an advantage if they observe and understand the meaning of another player's tell, particularly if the tell is unconscious and reliable.

Tell also comes from the word tale (a story or a lie)

A tell (in the Middle East) is an artificial mound formed by the accumulated remains of ancient settlements.

MYTELLINGTHOUGHTS...

- I want our audiences to be a able to see our (poker like) TELL in whatever we do. See our unconscious and reliable story of who we are and why we are doing what we do.
- Tell also comes from the word tale (a story or a lie.) Theatre almost died early on because Plato described it as "lie." And he wasn't far from the truth (ha.) It survived because Aristotle said that is was a natural human tendency to MIMIC others and to tell stories (real or fictitious ones.) And therefore we have theatre. Thank you Aristotle.
- Sanford Meisner says the definition of real acting is "to live truthfully under the imaginary circumstances". To live truthfully in the middle of a tale (lie.)
- And a tell (in the Middle East) is an artificial mound formed by the accumulated remains of ancient settlements. We are building LEON THEATRE on mounds formed by many years of accumulated remains from incredible artists, teachers, and performers. We owe them to tell our stories on top of theirs in new and excellent ways...

there is time to do every play, but for a play to be truly beautiful it needs to be done in the exact
 right time, in the right way, giving it honor and dignity, doing it well with effort worthy of the artists involved.

 beauty is something that attracts. our theatre should attract an audience.





INFORM



give (someone) facts or information; tell.

Latin from in (into) + form (shape)

we make pictures on the stage, we give a shape to the message of the play,

we tell our stories and they form us (and our audience) as we tell them.



fill, poured into, Latin from *in* (*into*) + *fuse* (*poured*)

- we will pour ourselves into our work. filling them with meaning.
- but also this makes me think of the word FUSE: to create a spark that lights a fire)
- this makes for a wonderful example of the power of AND: water & fire, something that soothes and something that burns, comforts and changes. both are powerful forces that can create danger or be a great asset to life...







INSPIRE

fill (someone) with the urge or ability to do or feel something, especially to do something creative.

create (a feeling, especially a positive one) in a person.

Latin from in (into) + spire (breathe)

- when we do something in LEON THEATRE we want to give it life, real life, breathe, words,
- something that is breathing is alive, let's give this concept LIFE through our work
- and what is a spire? the highest thing in the town, a higher thing of excellence, beauty, well crafted artwork. something people look at and wonder...







to include (something) as a necessary part or result.


to cause (a person or group) to experience or participate in an activity or situation

Latin from in (into) + volve (to roll, to fold, to become personally entangled with, have a relationship)

- we want students, faculty, parents, and the community to become INVOLVED in LEON THEATRE because what ultimately changes the world is relationships. what will change your life is the people you are in a personal relationship with, the face to face conversations,
- how can we involve our audience to change lives with our performances? we will use talk back sessions, meet and greets, other activities to INVOLVE them personally in our stories.
- we gain so much by choosing to relate to people, not to react in fear...but to form relationships.







make or become better.

develop or increase in mental capacity by education or experience.

achieve or produce something better than before

from Latin em (to make) prove (from prowe: to make more powerful, to make better, stronger, produce something better)

- not POWER for POWERS sake, but power to make ourselves and the audience better.
- not a starring role because i want to be a star. but because i want to tell this story and telling this story will change me in some way. maybe telling a really small story in a small role will change me more. make me more humble and let me see the world in a way that will improve me. RESPECT the small stories. look at them again. and again.





practice for later public performance.


mentally prepare or recite (words one intends to say).

MY THOUGHTS ABOUT REHEARSALS...


- i love that the word REHEARSE has the word HEAR in it. and the RE part. we need to be LISTENING to each other not just saying OUR part, but truly RE-HEARING what other people and other characters are saying on the stage.
- rehearse also means to re-harrow, and not many of you are farmers so let me fill you in on this... HARROW means to RAKE, to break up ground to plant seeds, to cause distress, to harvest. because you have to BREAK up the ground, put in your SWEAT, to plant some seeds. and then trust that the rain and sun will do their work, then you have a harvest. HARROW means to RAKE and to HARVEST, we are going to do some hard work of breaking up some fallow ground, but we are also going to do some HARVESTING and bringing in a crop of awesomeness.
- did you catch the word HEARSE in REHEARSAL? a hearse brings the dead body to the
 funeral. and the last sentence in our poem of the year is "PRACTICE RESURRECTION."
 which means "the revitalization or revival of something." let's practice resurrection. let's
 revitalize some plays, people, and performances. let's have some revival around this theatre
 arts studio and stage.
- ARE YOU READY FOR THIS YEAR? let's tell stories that make the world better that make us better that scare us in some way that we could fail a lot and grow a lot in the telling. let's tell difficult stories. let's do some difficult work and let's bring in a life giving HARVEST.



point of a story is for a character to change stories have heroes and that other guy, the guide that leads the hero to change.

every hero has a journey every journey is harrowing easy stories aren't interesting.

i am not the hero of the story i am telling here. you are. my purpose is to lead you to change. and the hero never really wants to change, he has to be forced to change. i am trying to help you become who you need to become in this world. and guess what ONLY by me trying to help you do i become who i need to become in this world. it is this weird power of & thing where me not focused on me, me focused on you actually helps me more than me focused on me would help me. THIS WORLD IS CRAZY, like this. but this is the only way i have found that it works. and i want you to find that power of AND also... cause i need this world to be better. and so do you.



- so i am not the hero in this thespian story. i make YOU the hero. i am the mentor/helper. with empathy & authority.
- but remember our power of AND... i can't be the hero in the story i am telling. but YOU are telling a different story and guess what...
 - you are not the hero of the story we are telling, the story we are telling is a story onstage. and that involves three areas of people, backstage, onstage, in front of the stage. in these stories, you are the other guy, the hero is the audience.
- you will tell the story with empathy and authority and the audience will change. they will learn something their lives will be different
- you can't be the hero. because only in you making someone else the hero, will you become who need you to be in this world.


